


What's next for the Green Deal?



The Green Trade Network is a group of policy experts from 20+ European research organisations, ranging from think tanks to NGOs and academia, conducting evidence-based research and outreach activities on the trade and environment nexus.

Every two months, GTN's newsletter offers a selection of the most important news on the trade and environment nexus and highlights past and future activities of the network's researchers.
