## 'Fit for 55' package extends EU carbon price signal to over two thirds of emissions by 2030

The European Commission's 'Fit for 55' package of proposals would extend EU-wide carbon pricing from around 22 percent of EU greenhouse gas emissions today to over two thirds of EU emissions by 2030, according to IEEP's initial analysis.

"This extension of carbon pricing could generate over €100bn per year by 2030 – if invested well, these revenues could reverse growing inequalities in Europe and ensure that lower income and marginalised EU citizens benefit from a just low carbon transition", said Tim Gore, Head of IEEP's Low Carbon and Circular Economy Programme.
