The Institute for European Environmental Policy (IEEP) and <u>Earthscan</u> have launched the online <u>Manual of European Environmental Policy</u>, a comprehensive guide on the EU legislation on the environment.

The interactive online publication will help decision makers, researchers and other users to keep track of EU environmental policy.

Previously published as a loose-leaf binder, the *Manual* has been fully revised to allow easy online access. The new online format will be the quickest and most efficient way to access analysis of more than 500 Directives, Regulations and Decisions as well as an overview of their implementation across the EU Member States. Special interactive features of the new *Manual* include a 'magic search', which will search any double-clicked word; share tools and a personalised 'My Manual' account.

"Keeping track of EU environmental policy is a major challenge – not only to stay on top of new law, but also how it is implemented, how it is interpreted by the European Court and what might be happening in the future. The *Manual* is the result of work, over more than two decades, by policy experts at the <u>Institute for European Environmental Policy (IEEP)</u> - a leading centre for the analysis and development of environmental and related policies in Europe.

A number of important changes in the EU legislation are expected next year, such as the review of the EU budget post- 2013 impacting spending on the environment; a substantive review of industrial pollution policy; the implementation of Europe's package of actions on climate change to deliver the 2020 targets, and a strategic review of waste and natural resources policies in 2011.
