IEEP's recent project, financed by the Clean Air Fund, investigates the social considerations around the design and implementation of Low Emission Zones (LEZ) in EU cities. The research has developed five city case studies – Stockholm, Milan, Brussels, Warsaw and Sofia – and a final research paper drawing together key emerging themes.

During this webinar, we will present our findings on key considerations for policymakers in relation to stakeholder engagement and social acceptability for LEZ.
